Brisbane South State Secondary College is leading the way with a future-focused approach, where inquiry-based learning places the student at the center of all planning. Partnering with world-class research institutions, they're reshaping the traditional classroom to foster independent thinking and adaptability. The school's work with the inquiry cycle showed us how building school culture and capacity can transform learning experiences





East Brisbane State School gave us a window into how mathematics can be a powerful tool for contributive learning. Their immersive workshops demonstrated how educators can improve pedagogical approaches and routines, empowering students to confidently contribute to their learning journey. The session was a perfect example of how deep learning fosters self-understanding and connection.
